Overview

This event is being held at a track we've grown to be very familiar with! GingerMan Raceway is a private road-racing course situated on a 350-acre site. It was developed by Dan Schnitta, a successful businessman from Chicago. The course was built in 1995 and opened for its first full season in 1996. The track layout was developed by Alan Wilson of Motorsports Development, Denver, Colorado, to take advantage of the natural terrain. Track grading and paving was done by Klett Construction Company, a local firm, using special polymerized asphalt material formulated to stand up to the stresses of racing and Michigan winters.

The track is 1.88 miles long and 36 feet wide, built on the naturally rolling landscape that existed there (formerly farm land). It has a variety of elevation changes, twists, and turns to challenge any driver. It was designed specifically as a club race course with wide, smooth paving and clear runoffs to avoid vehicle damage even when amateur drivers become overenthusiastic. This is a track that is easy to figure out with no real surprises, what you see is what you get. The course is also very spectator friendly, with several observation areas that overlook the entire course.

Corner workers will be on hand to signal us and watch over us. Full safety equipment including ambulances and paramedics are always present. Experienced drivers will be on hand to help you navigate the track and give you tips. Training will be available as well as in car instructors for those who'd like them.

Helpful Info: Items that may make the event more enjoyable and comfortable may include sunglasses, hat, suntan lotion, towel, folding chair, and umbrella (for sun and rain). Make sure you bring your camera from some great photo opportunities. Other items that might be of use are tire pressure gauge, driving gloves, and driving shoes.

At the event, there are many folks eager to lend a helping hand with anything if needed! So if you forget something, there's always a helpful soul around! But just don't forget your helmet!
